“deviant” male sexuality; others used less painful devices like penis-cameras to study women’s sexual responses and map the physiology of their arousal and orgasm. While researchers used the findings from their technological innovations to propose their own views of how people should view their bodies and should manage their sexual lives, their readers interpreted their findings to enact their own visions of sexuality. Drucker shows how the use of machines in sex research provided some of the intellectual underpinnings of the sexual revolution and the women’s and gay rights movements, and in turn how the sex research community developed new machines for investigations that would enhance sexual happiness rather than constrict it.

However, only a small minority of people who have sexual problems ever seek treatment. #3 The results of the 1992 National Health and Social Life Survey, which was conducted on 1,749 women and 1,410 men ages 18 to 59, revealed that 43 percent of women and 31 percent of men reported having a sexual problem in the past year. #4 The NHSL found that 25 percent of men struggle with rapid orgasm, and 17 percent are anxious about their sexual performance. Arousal is important in regulating consciousness,

attention, alertness, and information processing. It is crucial for motivating certain behaviours, such as mobility, the pursuit of nutrition, the fight-or-flight response and sexual activity (the arousal phase of Masters and Johnson's human sexual response cycle). It is also important in emotion and has been included in theories such as the James-Lange theory of emotion. Women's experience of sexual arousal is neglected in sexuality research. A phenomenological study devoted to understanding women's lived experiences as sexual beings best lends itself to

examining sexual arousal. Eight women, who reported satisfying experiences of sexual arousal (as defined by participants), participated in semi-structured, in-depth interviews. The women ranged in age, ethnicity, culture, religion, marital status, number of children, sexual orientation, and socioeconomic status. Information from the interview was analyzed from a phenomenological viewpoint. Three central themes emerged from the interview data. First, these women all experienced significant internal conflict between their subjective experience of sexual arousal and information provided to them about normal female sexual response. Second, this conflict motivated these women to seek out positive experiences and examples of sexual arousal. Third, women expressed definitions of satisfying experiencing of sexual arousal focused more on their emotional experience of sexual arousal rather than their physiological experience of sexual arousal. Gaining understanding about women's lived experience of sexual arousal provides psychologists with more

comprehensive descriptions of women's sexual experiences; empowers women, as their voices and sexual meanings are heard; and contributes valuable information to psychological research and clinical practice in sexuality.

However, they have done so by studying animals. It took science a long time to get its nerve up to put sexually aroused human beings under scientific scrutiny. #2 The first to dip a toe in the potentially scalding waters of research into human sexual response was William Masters, but he was aided by his associate, Virginia Johnson. Robert Latou Dickinson was the first doctor to take a detailed sexual history from each of his patients. #3 The author, Dickinson, was inspired and emboldened by the frank speech of some of his tenement house patients. Not only were these women at ease talking about their sexuality, but a few eventually allowed him to make observations. #4 The first scientist to bring

sexual arousal and orgasm into a laboratory was the psychologist John B. Watson. He chafed at science's reluctance to study human sexuality as it studies human nutrition or planets.

Masters and Johnson on Sex and Human Loving Elsevier Health Sciences
In order to determine whether response to a sexually explicit stimulus could be predicted by demographic, attitudinal, knowledge, and religiosity factors, this study invited individuals to the Psychophysiology of Sexual Health lab at the University of Guelph for testing. Fifty-five participants visited the lab on one occasion where they answered a number of questionnaires and watched a series of video stimuli while continuously monitoring their sexual arousal. Participants reported being sexually aroused by the stimuli, however, this arousal was not predicted by the above factors. Several between group differences in sexual response outcomes were found on the basis of gender, sexual orientation, level of sex guilt and religiosity. This study contributes to existing research on factors that impact sexual

response. Contrary to prior research, results of this study indicate no

significant differences in self-reported sexual

arousal to a sexual stimulus between males and females.
