This monograph reports on studies carried out to investigate this "suspension of sense-making" in answering word problems. Making Sense of Word Problems

After a long period where it has been conceived as iconoclastic and almost forbidden, the question of language origins is now at the centre of a rich debate, confronting acute proposals and original
